Habitat III Key Thematic Meeting on Informal Settlements

Last week, the United Nations hosted a meeting in advance of Habitat III, focused on incorporating informal settlements and slums into the New Urban Agenda that will ultimately come out of the conference in October.

The conference, which took place on April 7th and 8th in Pretoria South Africa, allowed stakeholders to provide guidance to the Habitat III secretariat on issues such as tenure security and housing, livelihoods, safety, and governance. The meetings also discussed the challenges of crafting effective policy, providing infrastructure and services, and building capacity and for the future.

The outcome document from the meeting, a draft is available here, will be one of many inputs into the final negotiations at Habitat III. IHC is pleased that inclusive upgrading and development is a key theme throughout the document, and that secure tenure, adequate housing and provision of basic services are all highlighted as critical parts of improving informal settlements worldwide.

Habitat III Event at the Wilson Center: Localizing the SDGs

In September 2015, world leaders agreed on 17 Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) with 169 targets to end poverty, fight inequality and injustice, and tackle climate change by 2030. Many of the SDGs are interrelated and will require governments to develop integrated and cross-cutting approaches to make the goals a reality. Cities and local stakeholders will play a critical role in implementing the SDGs.

Please join the Woodrow Wilson Center for a discussion organized by the Habitat III U.S. National Committee together with the Wilson Center, Urban Institute, and USAID to examine local strategies for realizing the 2030 Agenda. Representatives from 3 US Government Agencies, nonprofits, think tanks and multilateral organizations will take part in two panel discussions, on the relevance of urbanization across the SDGs and on building a local SDG infrastructure.
